Created by a joint JCG and VCJ student forum: June 2021 Due for review by student representatives from both Colleges: May 2022




### UCAS Timeline

- Early Entrants (Medicine, Dentistry, Veterinary Sciences, Oxbridge) Deadline 15th October.
- All other applicants: Deadline 17th November (Internal) UCAS 26th Jan.
- (7th Sept 1st day of completed applications accepted by UCAS)
- Personal statements, 5 courses / universities. Aspirational, solid, safe choices depending on predicted grades.


